Eventually they plan to further improve the external facade in the next six months thru the City's facade improvement program. ### **East Bay Greenway Public Meeting**

# Successful Citywide Garage Sale & Neighborhood Cleanup

The Recycling Program hosted its annual garage sale and neighborhood cleanup event on Oct. 7. Over 200 residents hosted garage sales and approximately 250 residents participated in the Neighborhood Cleanup event. The event was funded by the Community Care Initiative and offered an opportunity for residents to reuse, recycle and properly dispose of unwanted material. In total, the program collected:

- 4 tons of scrap metal
- 2 tons of wood
- 60 appliances
- 75 mattresses
- 300 pounds of batteries
- 28 tons of household waste was sent to landfill.
